Scholarships for New Students for 2023

St Columba College is delighted to offer the following Scholarships for students yet to enrol in 2023. These scholarships aim to create an educational opportunity for a young person who would otherwise not have access to an Anglican and Catholic education.

Year 6 - 11 Academic Scholarships

- Entering Years 6–11
- For students who demonstrate outstanding application to their studies and high achievement and aptitude in one or more curriculum area
- Full remission of tuition fees for Years 6–12.

Year 6 Bor Mabil Justice Scholarships

- Entering Year 6
- · Awarded to students who show potential in studies, participation and leadership
- · Family financial circumstances taken into account
- Full remission of tuition fees for Years 6–12.

Music Scholarships

- A limited number of Music Scholarships for Year 6-9 students who have potential to excel as players of violin, piano, guitar, drums and voice
- Full remission of the instrumental tuition fee for one of the instruments listed above and full remission of that instrument's hire fee
- 40% remission of tuition fees while enrolled.

Criteria for Successful Applicants

Applicants must demonstrate their abilities to benefit from a St Columba education and a willingness to contribute to the life of the College. Successful applicants will demonstrate all or some of the following:

- · Ability to embrace the ethos and values of the College
- A positive attitude to learning
- · Evidence of striving for personal excellence across all learning areas
- · Active interest in co-curricular activities
- Well-developed communication skills
- Enthusiastic participation in College life
- The potential to become a positive role model for the current student body and an ambassador for St Columba College.

Applicants for Academic Scholarships will be asked to provide evidence of their academic achievement and may be asked to undertake an AGAT test as part of the application process.

Terms and Conditions

The Scholarship may be terminated or suspended due to poor performance or behaviour problems. An evaluation will be made for each recipient to determine if he or she is still eligible to continue with the Scholarship for the following year.

Only one sibling per family shall be considered for the Scholarship Program.

Selection Process

Applicants will be invited to an interview with the Scholarship Panel. References, current academic reports and the interview will be taken into account. Based on all of the information, a decision will be made on which students will be awarded a Scholarship.

Successful applicants will be required to participate in Voice/Instrumental ensembles/bands rehearsals and performances. The College will have the right to cancel the Scholarship if attitude, attendance, self-practice and participation is poor.



Scholarship Frequently Asked Questions

I have completed the application. How do I submit my child's current photograph, copy of the two recent reports and current NAPLAN results?

Please bring copies only of the requested documents to the interview. These will remain at St Columba for assessment post interview.

Can I provide additional information to support my child's application?

Your child can create and bring along with her/him a small portfolio to be discussed during the interview.

What will my daughter or son need to demonstrate to be awarded a Scholarship?

- A level of skill development in the selected instrument (Musical Scholarship Application).

When will I be notified of an interview?

You will be notified after the closing date: Wednesday 26 October 2022.

When will the interviews be held?

Interviews will be held during the school day in Term 3.

Can I organise a personal tour of the College?

Scholarship applicants are requested to attend the College Tour on Friday 26 August at 6pm. No personal tours will be offered as part of this process.

How may Scholarships will be awarded?

There is no set number of scholarships offered at each year level. The College has a number of scholarships available and will award them on a case-by-case basis.

When will I be informed as to whether or not my child has been successful?

It is expected that all applicants will be informed of the outcome by the end of Term 3.

When do I have to accept or reject the Scholarship offer if my child is successful?

You will have 5 working days to finalise your child's enrolment paperwork and submit the \$100 Acceptance of Enrolment Fee.

If my child is successful can I postpone the Scholarship to the following year?

No, Scholarships are only for 2023.

Can the College provide feedback on how my child could improve the application if not successful?

Due to the large number of applications and in fairness to all applicants the College is not able to offer individual feedback on why an application was not successful or areas for improvement in the future. No exceptions will apply.

My child was unsuccessful in gaining a Scholarship. Can they apply again next year?

Your child is welcome to apply for a future Scholarship even if unsuccessful in the past.





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
