Academic Endeavour Awards

We believe that an important part of acknowledging student achievement incorporates rewarding a student's positive attitude and commitment to their studies. Endeavour relates to a student's attitude and effort rather than focusing on an academic result. The qualifiers in how a student approaches learning and citizenship are used to determine those who are eligible for this award. The Academic Endeavour Award seeks to commend students who demonstrate unerring commitment to 'doing their best' in all aspects relating to their study.

Junior School (Year 3–5)

Selection Process: Awarded to each student who demonstrates 'Excellent' Effort in a minimum of 6 subjects. Exceptions to these criteria are at the discretion of the Head of School. **Nature of the Award**: Certificate

Award Ceremony: Junior School Academic Assembly in Term 3 for Semester One results and Prayer and Presentation Evening in Term 4 for Semester Two results

Middle School (Year 6-9)

Selection Process: Awarded to each student who demonstrates 'Excellent' commitment to learning and citizenship across all subjects. This is calculated by a minimum of 6 'Excellent' qualifiers in each subject. Exceptions to these criteria are at the discretion of the Head of School.

Nature of the Award: Certificate

Senior School (Year 10–12)

Caritas Awards

The Arts Award

The Arts Award recognizes and acknowledges the talent, effort and participation of students in the Visual Arts or Performing Arts Areas. It will be awarded to a student who demonstrates exceptional talent and 'Excellent' Effort in an area of the Arts namely Drama, Dance, Music, Visual Arts or Design. Open to all Performing Arts (R-5), Visual Art, Visual Art - Design, Drama, Music or Musical students on each campus with any of the following criteria:

- Achieve at least a B in one or more of the Arts subject area
- Demonstrate a passion, dedication and natural talent in one or more of the Arts areas
- Demonstrate a commitment that goes above and beyond to the Arts subject (e.g. assists at lunchtimes, attend after school rehearsals for drama or the musical, be part of Choir or Columba Rumba, attend instrumental lessons)
- Exemplary talent in visual arts/design, singing, playing music instruments, dancing and acting as well as potential in creating music/dance
- Demonstrate outstanding collaborative skills in group performance
- Show bravery and take risks with their learning and talent

Selection Process: The Arts Staff nominate students who fit the criteria and state the reasons why they are nominated. The Principal decides on the Award winner. **Nature of the Award:** Certificate

Award Ceremony: Academic Assembly in Term 3 for Semester One. and Prayer and Presentation in Term 4 for Semester Two.

Global Citizenship Award

The Global Citizenship Award is awarded to a student who shows continuous Excellent effort and commitment to doing their best in all lessons/ aspects of Indonesian and/or Language Learning. Open to all students learning a Language on each campus with any of the following criteria:

- Demonstrate exceptional progress or outstanding improvement in Language Learning, including written work
- Display a positive attitude to their learning with strong endeavour and commitment

- Contribute to language development or intercultural activities in their school through the development of games, presentations or activities for fellow students and/or staff
- Demonstrate advocacy for a multicultural Australia through either:
 - o Demonstrate a willingness to share intercultural knowledge
 - o Demonstrate an understanding of the value of multilingualism
 - Knowledge of Australian careers where bilingualism is a benefit.
- Evidence of participation or investigation of at least one of the following:
 - o Cultural events
 - o Current Affairs
 - o Arts & Culture
 - o Study Group/Penpals

Sports Allrounder Award

The Sports Allrounder Award **r**ecognises a student who is considered an exemplary sports ambassador of the College. Whilst the depth and variety of sports participated is considered, the main focus is on the level of achievement. In judging the level of achievement, the state, national or representative level is considered. Open to all students involved in sports on each campus with any of the following criteria:

- Achievement at national, state, or representative level
- Represent the school in carnivals, knockout sport or Northern Zone carnivals without necessarily being a champion
- Display honesty, truthfulness and integrity, both on and off the court/field
- Self-control and exemplary demeanour on the court/field is demonstrated at all times
- A positive manner in which opponents are treated on the court/field is demonstrated at all times
- Play to the best of their ability at all times
- Respectful to all umpires, officials, spectators and the opposition
